

The 2000 Cohos Evamy Partners Scholarship

In Honour of Michael Evamy

The Cohos Evamy Partners and the Michael Evamy Scholarship Board of Trustees are pleased to announce the second year of The Cohos Evamy Partners Scholarship In Honour of Michael Evamy. This scholarship, to be awarded annually, is available to a Canadian student attending a Canadian School of Architecture in the year prior to their final year of study.

The award has been established to honour the memory of Michael Evamy, a partner who was instrumental in building the practice of The Cohos Evamy Partners from 1966 to 1993. The award is to provide financial assistance to the selected student to undertake a specific research project based on a field of study determined by the Board of Trustees. The intent of the study is to enrich and advance the candidate's personal and professional experience and knowledge on a topic relevant to the practice of Architecture.

The value of the award in 2000 is \$5000.00 plus a secondary amount of up to \$3000.00 available for project related expenses, including travel expenses, during the course of investigation. The application deadline for the award is March 15, 2000. The successful candidate will be notified and the award publicly announced in April 2000.

A. 2000 Field of Study

Cultural Memory and the 21st Century

One of the greatest influences on the architectural profession at the end of the 20th century is globalization. Advances in technology and communication have influenced design, contributed to a global expansion of the practice of architecture and broadened our collective impact on the planet and its' inhabitants. Does this globalization impact the nature of architecture as an expression of a culture, and is so, how?

B. Eligibility and Conditions

This award is open to all Canadian students enrolled in a Canadian School of Architecture in the year prior to their final year of study.

Selection will be based on the following criteria:

- The candidate's expressed interest in the scholarship and field of study
- The specific nature of their investigation relative to the selected field of study
- Demonstrated academic achievement and leadership ability
- Confirmation of willingness to work within the available funds
- Confirmation of willingness to present their results as described in "C".
- The award money must be used within 1 calendar year following notification of the award

C. Presentation

The successful candidate will be asked to prepare a talk for public presentation and publication. The Cohos Evamy Partners will organize the talk together with a reception. The Michael Evamy Talks on Architecture will be open to the general public as well as to the profession. Travel expenses for the Talks will be funded separately from the Scholarship.

The candidate will give a similar talk in September of the following year in the student's school.

D. How to Apply

The application is to be received by The Cohos Evamy Partners no later than **March 15, 2000.**

The application shall be submitted in an 8 1/2 x 11" format and is limited to a total of 10 pages. Please provide the following information:

1. Cover Page
The cover page should clearly indicate the applicant's name, title of the proposed project and date of submission.
2. Table of Contents
3. Project Description
Clearly and concisely identify the nature and objectives of the proposed project and how it relates to the specified field of study. Describe the scope of the project and define what the projects intends to accomplish.
4. Project Method
Outline how you propose to conduct your study (e.g. travel, research) including the general approach to the collection and analysis of information (e.g. photography, sketching, literature review, interviews, etc.)
5. Project Schedule
Outline the time frame and location(s) of the study including time allotted for specific project tasks. If travel is involved, provide a proposed itinerary.
6. Project Budget
Outline anticipated costs related to undertaking the proposed project. Include a breakdown of essential expenses such as travel (airfare, food, accommodation), telephone, postage, photography, photocopying, supplies, etc.
7. Portfolio
Provide one example of previous project work demonstrating design and presentation capabilities.
8. Information on the Applicant
Please provide the following information:
 - i. Name
 - ii. Address

- iii. Telephone number
- iv. Date of birth
- v. School of Architecture
- vi. Academic record
- vii. Awards, Honours, Grants received

9. References

Each applicant is required to obtain three(3) letters of support demonstrating the applicant's leadership skills and ability to complete the proposed project. The letters are to be sent directly by the reference to The Cohos Evamy Partners.

10. All material submitted will become the property of The Cohos Evamy Partners Scholarship and will not be returned to the applicant.
