A person with AD can live from 3-20 years or more from the onset of symptoms and at some point, that person will require 24 hour care including assistance with daily activities such as eating, grooming and toileting. 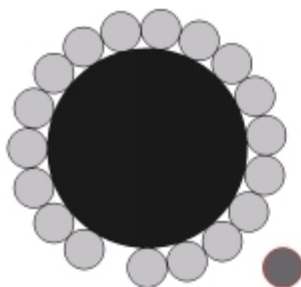
